Naplan

Next week students in grade 3 and 5 will commence their NAPLAN testing. NAPLAN tests assess student knowledge and skill in Writing, Reading, Language Conventions (Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation) and Numeracy.

We will be completing our writing test on Wednesday the 15th, this will be followed by Reading (Monday the 20th), Language conventions (Tuesday the 21st) and Maths (Wednesday the 22nd). The result of the tests provide information for students, parents, teachers and principals, which can be used to improve student success. I feel it is very important to remember that NAPLAN is just one form of testing taken on one particular day and should be viewed as a guideline and not as a definitive measure as to where each individual child sits.

Later in the year, you will receive your child's individual NAPLAN report. All parents of children completing NAPLAN this year should have received a signmee going into full detail of the testing procedure. If you did not receive this please contact the office.



I asked my brother what moved him when he looked in that mirror and he told me it was the fact that someone had taken the time to give him care – particularly at a time when he was not giving himself the care he needed.

Now, once a month he jumps off the hamster wheel and gives himself a day of self-care and encourages his workmates to do the same thing.
