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Principal's Message

NAPLAN

Next week students in Grade 3 and 5 will commence their NAPLAN testing. NAPLAN tests assess student knowledge and skill in Writing, Reading, Language Conventions (Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation) and Numeracy.

Students will be completing their Writing test on Wednesday the 13th, Reading on Thursday the 14th, Language Conventions on Monday the 18th and Numeracy on Tuesday the 19th. The result of the tests provide information for students, parents, teachers and principals, which can be used to improve student success. I feel it is very important to remember that NAPLAN is just one form of testing, taken on one particular day and should be viewed as a guideline and not as a definitive measure as to where each individual child sits.

Later in the year, you will receive your child's individual NAPLAN report. All parents of children completing NAPLAN this year should have received a compass notification going into full detail of the testing procedure. If you did not receive this please contact the office.
